Course Goals

- (1) To understand the characteristics of an outstanding law enforcement leader
- (2) To assess the effects of bad leadership on a unit's performance
- (3) To determine what the student can do to improve their ability to lead

<u>Course Overview</u>

- (1) Introduce officers to the Army definition of 'leadership': there will be a class discussion on how to *influence* people by providing direction, purpose, and motivation to accomplish the mission and develop the organization in a law enforcement environment
- (2) To work in teams to analyze the attributes of an outstanding law enforcement leader, the effects if those attributes are missing, and how the student can improve relative to these attributes
- (3) To work in teams to analyze the intellectual attributes of an outstanding law enforcement leader, the effects if those attributes are missing, and how the student can improve relative to these intellectual attributes
- (4) To work in teams to analyze the competencies of an outstanding law enforcement leader, the effects if those competencies are missing, and how the student can improve relative to these competencies
