## ADVANCED POLICE MOTORCYCLE TRAINING

**\*\*NEW\*\*** – **THREE** days of training for **ALL** motor officers

**Course Dates & Times:** July 12<sup>th</sup> 0900-1700 (late arrival available)\*  
July 13<sup>th</sup> 0800-1700  
July 14<sup>th</sup> 0800-1700 (early departure available)\*

**Location:** WSP Training Facility – Shelton, Washington

### Course Objectives:

1. To acquaint the experienced police motorcycle rider with evasive riding, collision avoidance techniques, and curve negotiation when operating a motorcycle at above normal speeds.
2. To measure and evaluate the ability of the police motorcycle rider to operate and control their motorcycle under stress while making enforcement/tactical decisions.

### Equipment Required:

- Police motorcycle in good operating condition.
- Instructors will visually inspect brakes, tires, and overall visual condition.
- Motorcycles deemed unsafe to proceed will be unable to start the course until repairs are made.
- Training uniform, ¾ or full-face helmet, riding boots
- Eye protection, gloves, ballistic vest, rain gear
- Duty belt and vest are recommended as we will have to commute (in public) between the training facility and lodging, as well as any off-site meals.

### Prerequisite:

- Successful completion of the 80-hour Basic Motor School or equivalent

### Cost:

- \$150 per rider to cover the WSP track and rider fees.

### Lodging / Food:

- is up to the participant/agency
- however, we recommend the Little Creek Casino Resort in Shelton [Little Creek Casino](#)

**Other Notes:**

- \*July 12<sup>th</sup> Friday Late Arrival
  - Instructors are required to arrive at or before 0900 hours
  - Non-instructors have two options
    - arrive at 0900 hours and ride the cone patterns in the infield
    - arrive at 1300 hours when the official training starts for all non-instructors
- \*July 14<sup>th</sup> Sunday Early Departure
  - All riders have two options
    - 1400 hours, any rider can leave, official training is over
    - 1400 hours to 1700 hours, running of the full course is available
- Arrival and departure times are set to minimize opening and closing of the gate while track is active, you will ***not*** be able to come and go as you please
