STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Respondent.

2017 2021. Between approximately February and October ANDREI CONSTANTIN, a certified peace officer with the Seattle Police Department (SPD) engaged in conduct and/or a pattern of conduct that failed to meet the ethical and professional standards of a peace officer; and/or disrupted, diminished, or otherwise jeopardized public trust or confidence in the law enforcement profession; and/or demonstrated an inability or unwillingness to uphold his sworn oath to enforce the Constitution and laws of the United States and the state of Washington. After engaging in this conduct, CONSTANTIN was terminated from the SPD on or around August 30, 2022. His certification is subject to discipline under **RCW** 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv) and RCW 43.101.105(3)(k). The circumstances are as follows:

Count I

Between approximately May 2020 and October 2021, CONSTANTIN engaged in conduct and/or a pattern of conduct that failed to meet the ethical and professional standards of a peace officer; and/or disrupted, diminished, or otherwise jeopardized

public trust or confidence in law enforcement; and/or demonstrated an inability or unwillingness to uphold the officer's sworn oath to enforce the Constitution and laws of the United States and the state of Washington when he made a series of online social media posts on Twitter that: (1) celebrated, justified, trivialized, and/or ridiculed the injuries of civilians involved in Black Lives Matter protests, including injuries caused by law enforcement; and/or (2) suggested an area of Seattle occupied by Black Lives Matter protesters should be "fixed" by "dropping Napalm on it;" and/or (3) celebrated and/or justified violence toward civilians he believed were affiliated with the activist movement known as "Antifa;" and/or (4) celebrated and/or trivialized crime, including homicide, in Seattle; and/or (5) justified and/or trivialized violence between civilians that arose during a dispute about wearing COVID-19 masks; and/or (6) demeaned Seattle Police Department leadership. CONSTANTIN'S posts violated multiple SPD policies, including its professionalism policy (SPD Investigation No. 2021OPA-0458). CONSTANTIN'S officer certification subject discipline peace is to under RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv).

AND/OR

Count II

Between February 2017 and October 2021, CONSTANTIN engaged in a pattern of conduct that failed to meet the ethical and professional standards required of a peace officer; and/or disrupted, diminished, or otherwise jeopardized public trust or confidence in the law enforcement profession; and/or demonstrated an inability or unwillingness to uphold the officer's sworn oath to enforce the Constitution and laws of the United States and the state of Washington. The pattern of misconduct included the following: (1) on or around February 27, 2017, CONSTANTIN conducted a high-risk vehicle stop without reasonable suspicion, which violated SPD's policies governing investigative detentions and officer discretion, resulting in a written reprimand (SPD Investigation No. 2017OPA-

0215); and/or (2) on or around February 19, 2020, while engaging with a combative subject, CONSTANTIN failed to employ proper de-escalation techniques, mocked and was disrespectful toward the subject, and turned his camera off prematurely, which violated SPD's professionalism and body-worn camera policies, resulting in a one-day 4 suspension without pay (SPD Investigation No. 2020OPA-0124); and/or (3) on or around December 24, 2020, CONSTANTIN shattered the driver's side window of a 7 civilian's vehicle without a legitimate law enforcement reason during a traffic stop and then failed to report the incident to either a supervisor or in the incident report, which violated SPD's professionalism and documentation policies, resulting in an eight-day 10 suspension (SPD Investigation No. 2021OPA-0208); and/or (4) on or around June 22, 2021, CONSTANTIN made false, incomplete, and/or misleading statements about the December 24, 2020, incident during an investigative interview with SPD's Office of Police Accountability; and/or (5) on or around October 25, 2021, while conducting an accident investigation, CONSTANTIN failed to employ proper de-escalation techniques 14 and was disrespectful to a subject, which violated SPD's professionalism and de-15 escalation policies and would have resulted in discipline had SPD not already 16 terminated CONSTANTIN for the conduct described in Count I (SPD Investigation No. 2021OPA-0478). CONSTANTIN'S peace officer certification is subject to discipline 18 under RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv). AND/OR 20 /// 22 111 23 ///
