15	law. BABINO'S conduct also failed to meet the ethical and professional standards of a	
16	peace officer and jeopardized public trust in law enforcement. Accordingly, BABINO'S	
17	peace officer certification is subject to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(e) and	
18	RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv). The circumstances are as follows:	
19	Count I	
20	On or around June 17, 2022, BABINO used an excessive amount of force while	
21	restraining a female inmate. This use of force could reasonably be expected to cause	
22	physical injury and violated the ACSO's Use of Force and Deescalation policies and/or	
23	RCW 9A.36.041 (Assault in the Fourth Degree). BABINO'S peace officer certification is	
24	subject to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(e).

2	On or around June 17, 2022, BABINO engaged in conduct that failed to meet the		
3	ethical and professional standards required of a peace officer and jeopardized public		
4	trust in law enforcement when he used excessive force as described in Count I.

6	RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv).
