STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Respondent.

On or about February 4, 2021, JASON WINDHAM, a certified peace officer with the Kent Police Department (KPD), separated from his employing agency after engaging in conduct that failed to meet the ethical and professional standards required of a peace officer and/or disrupted, diminished, or otherwise jeopardized public trust or confidence in the law enforcement profession. This misconduct subjects WINDHAM's peace officer certification to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv) and (3)(k). The misconduct is as follows:

COUNT I

On or about November 7, 2020, while attending an off-duty party involving KPD officers, WINDHAM engaged in conduct that failed to meet the ethical and professional standards required of a peace officer and/or disrupted, diminished or otherwise jeopardized public trust or confidence in the law enforcement profession when he: (1) performed oral sex on a female co-worker who did not consent, and/or could not consent, and/or was mentally incapacitated within the meaning of

1	RCW 9A.44.010(7) and therefore incapable of consenting; and/or (2) prevented the
2	female co-worker from leaving the room and/or other people from entering the room
3	where WINDHAM was located. WINDHAM's peace officer certification is subject to
4	discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv).

7	<u>COUNT II</u>
8	On or about February 4, 2021, WINDHAM separated from KPD after engaging
9	in the misconduct described in Count I. WINDHAM's peace officer certification is
10	subject to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(k).
