1	Specifically, on three separate occasions, LEMONS made false or misleading
2	statements implying that he was unaware of how his patrol vehicle came to be
3	damaged. LEMONS made these false statements to three separate WWPD peace
4	officers, including his sergeant. After making these false or misleading statements,
5	LEMONS was terminated from employment with WWPD on or around June 30, 2023.
6	LEMONS' peace officer certification is subject to mandatory revocation under
7	RCW 43.101.105(2)(d).
8	AND/OR
9	Count II
10	Between May 9 – 12, 2023, LEMONS engaged in conduct that failed to meet the
11	ethical and professional standards of a peace officer and/or disrupted, diminished or
12	otherwise jeopardized public trust or confidence in the law enforcement profession by
13	making false or misleading statements to three separate WWPD officers, as described
14	in Count I. This misconduct subjects LEMONS' peace officer certification to discipline
15	under RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv).
16	AND/OR
17	Count III
18	On or about June 30, 2023, LEMONS was terminated from employment with
19	WWPD after engaging in the misconduct described in Count II. LEMONS' peace officer
20	certification is subject to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(k).
