STATEMENT OF CHARGES

On or about November 28, 2023, the Washington State Criminal Justice Training
Commission (Commission) received a complaint alleging that MICHAEL FLACK, a
certified peace officer with the Snohomish County Sheriff's Office (SCSO), engaged in
sexual harassment and other misconduct. Following an investigation, the Commission
determined that FLACK'S certification is subject to discipline pursuant to
RCW 43.101.105(3)(f) and (j)(iv). The circumstances are as follows:

Count I

On or about October 2022, while on-duty as a peace officer, FLACK committed
sexual harassment as defined by state law. Specifically, FLACK engaged in conduct
that created a hostile work environment for a female officer who was also employed by
SCSO. FLACK'S peace officer certification is subject to discipline under RCW
43.101.105(3)(f).

2	Between approximately June 2022 and December 2022, FLACK engaged in a
3	pattern of conduct that failed to meet the ethical and professional standards of a peace
4	officer and/or disrupted, diminished, or otherwise jeopardized public trust or confidence
5	in the law enforcement profession when he: (1) sexually harassed a female officer, as
6	described in Count I; and/or (2) while under investigation for the misconduct alleged in
7	Count I, sent unethical, unwanted, and inappropriate messages to the female victim of
8	one of his criminal investigations. FLACK'S peace officer certification is subject to
9	discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv).
