ARNOLD also failed to meet the ethical and professional standards of a peace officer and/or disrupted, diminished or otherwise jeopardized public trust or confidence in the law enforcement profession and/or demonstrated an inability or unwillingness to uphold his sworn oath to enforce the Constitution and laws of the United States and the state of Washington. His certification is subject to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(h) and (3)(j)(iv).

COUNT I

Between approximately 2021 to 2023, ARNOLD engaged in conduct involving prejudice or discrimination against a person on the basis of race, religion, creed, color, national origin, immigration status, disability, genetic information, marital status, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, age, sexual orientation, or military and veteran status. Specifically, while on-duty as a WSP Sergeant, ARNOLD made inappropriate and/or disparaging statements to subordinate officers involving prejudice or discrimination against people on the basis of sex, gender, gender identity and/or gender expression. ARNOLD's peace officer certification is subject to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(h).

COUNT II

Between approximately 2021 to 2023, ARNOLD engaged in conduct and/or a pattern of conduct that failed to meet the ethical and professional standards of a peace officer and/or disrupted, diminished, or otherwise jeopardized public trust or confidence in law enforcement and/or demonstrated an inability or unwillingness to uphold the officer's sworn oath to enforce the Constitution and laws of the United States and the state of Washington. Specifically, while on-duty as a WSP Sergeant, ARNOLD: (1) engaged in the discriminatory conduct described in Count I; and/or (2) made inappropriate, sexually explicit statements and/or gestures to officers, including but not limited to statements about female citizens and arrestees; and/or (3) made violent comments and/or gestures to subordinate officers, including but not limited to making statements concerning his desire to shoot and/or stab people and/or open fire in public establishments; and/or (4) made inappropriate, discomfiting, and/or violent comments and/or gestures toward vulnerable populations, including but not limited to the unhoused

1	and those struggling with mental health and/or addiction issues; and/or (5) sought
2	and/or encouraged subordinate officers to seek loopholes to circumvent state laws,
3	including but not limited to laws regarding police pursuits. ARNOLD's peace officer
