STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Between January 2016 and October 2023, TODD ROGGENKAMP, a certified police officer with the Mercer Island Police Department (MIPD), engaged in conduct or a pattern of conduct that failed to meet the ethical and professional standards required of a peace officer and/or disrupted, diminished or otherwise jeopardized public trust or confidence in the law enforcement profession. Additionally, in October 2023, ROGGENKAMP engaged in conduct that, through fraud or misrepresentation, used the position of peace officer for personal gain. Such misconduct subjects ROGGENKAMP'S peace officer certification to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(g) and RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv). The circumstances are as follows:

Count I

On or around October 9, 2023, while off-duty, ROGGENKAMP engaged in conduct that, through fraud or misrepresentation, used the position of peace officer for personal gain when he: (1) showed his police officer credentials to a bartender to persuade her to allow him into a closed bar; and/or (2) informed staff at the King County

1 Jail that he was a “sergeant” to persuade them to release his spouse. ROGGENKAMP’S
2 peace officer certification is subject to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(g).

3 AND/OR

4 **Count II**

5 On or about October 9, 2023, ROGGENKAMP engaged in conduct that failed to
6 meet the ethical and professional standards required of a peace officer and/or disrupted,
7 diminished or otherwise jeopardized public trust or confidence in the law enforcement
8 profession and/or demonstrated an inability or unwillingness to uphold the officer’s
9 sworn oath to enforce the Constitution and laws of the United States and the state of
10 Washington, when, during a traffic stop with deputies from the King County Sheriff’s
11 Office (KCSO): (1) he falsely told the KCSO deputies that he was a firefighter with the
12 City of Bothell; and/or (2) he falsely told the KCSO deputies that a physical altercation
13 he personally witnessed did not occur; and/or (3) he repeatedly questioned the authority
14 of the KCSO deputies to stop the vehicle, including by encouraging the driver of the
15 vehicle to flee the scene; and/or (4) he was confrontational and argumentative with the
16 KCSO deputies, including by calling them disparaging names. ROGGENKAMP’S peace
17 officer certification is subject to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv).

18 AND/OR

19 **Count III**

20 On or about October 9, 2023, while off-duty, ROGGENKAMP engaged in
21 conduct that failed to meet the ethical and professional standards required of a peace
22 officer and/or disrupted, diminished or otherwise jeopardized public trust or confidence
23 in the law enforcement profession and/or demonstrated an inability or unwillingness to
24 uphold the officer’s sworn oath to enforce the Constitution and laws of the United States
25 and the state of Washington, when: (1) he drove to the King County Jail within an hour
26 of when he was observed by KCSO deputies as being highly intoxicated; and/or (2) he

1 threatened to block the sally port of the King County Jail if his spouse was not released;
2 and/or (3) he attempted to use his status as sergeant to gain favorable treatment, as
3 described in Count I. ROGGENKAMP'S peace officer certification is subject to discipline
4 under RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv).

5 AND/OR

6 **Count IV**

7 Between January 2016 and October 2023, ROGGENKAMP engaged in a pattern
8 of conduct that failed to meet the ethical and professional standards required of a peace
9 officer and/or disrupted, diminished or otherwise jeopardized public trust or confidence
10 in the law enforcement profession and/or demonstrated an inability or unwillingness to
11 uphold the officer's sworn oath to enforce the Constitution and laws of the United States
12 and the state of Washington, when: (1) with the aim of extorting money, he threatened
13 his ex-wife with the release of embarrassing sexual photos and/or videos; and/or (2) he
14 threatened his former in-laws by telling them he would seek a protective order
15 prohibiting them from seeing their grandchildren; and/or (3) while at a bar, he directed
16 obscene language at female patrons and identified himself as a police officer; and/or
17 (4) while on-duty in a supervisory role, he attached a dildo sex toy to the rear window
18 of a subordinate officer's fully-marked patrol car without the officer's knowledge, and
19 allowed the officer to conduct his community patrol duties for several hours with the sex
20 toy affixed to his car; and/or (5) he engaged in the conduct described in Count I; and/or
21 (6) he engaged in the conduct described in Count II; and/or (7) he engaged in the
22 conduct described in Count III. ROGGENKAMP'S peace officer certification is subject
23 to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv).
